Frequently Asked Questions about Volunteering

What if I have no teaching experience?

JA provides the easy to follow curriculum so you will never be at a loss for words or not know what to do. Each program includes volunteer guide that explains each lesson in detail.

All new volunteers participate in a 30 minute on-line training. The training provides an overview of the history of JA and includes some basic classroom management techniques.

How will I be assigned a grade and a school?

JA offers programs for students from Kindergarten to 12th grade. You and your program manager will work together to find the best fit for you. We are always looking for volunteering, so just ask about our current needs!

What is the time commitment?

That depends on the grade level class program. All elementary school programs involve five 30-40 minute classroom visits. Middle school classes have six 45 minute lessons. The high school classes range from 7-12 visits (depending on what program you teach) and last hour per class.

Will I make an impact?

YES! 1 in every 4 JA alum go into the industry that his or her JA volunteer was in.

Who determines the schedule?

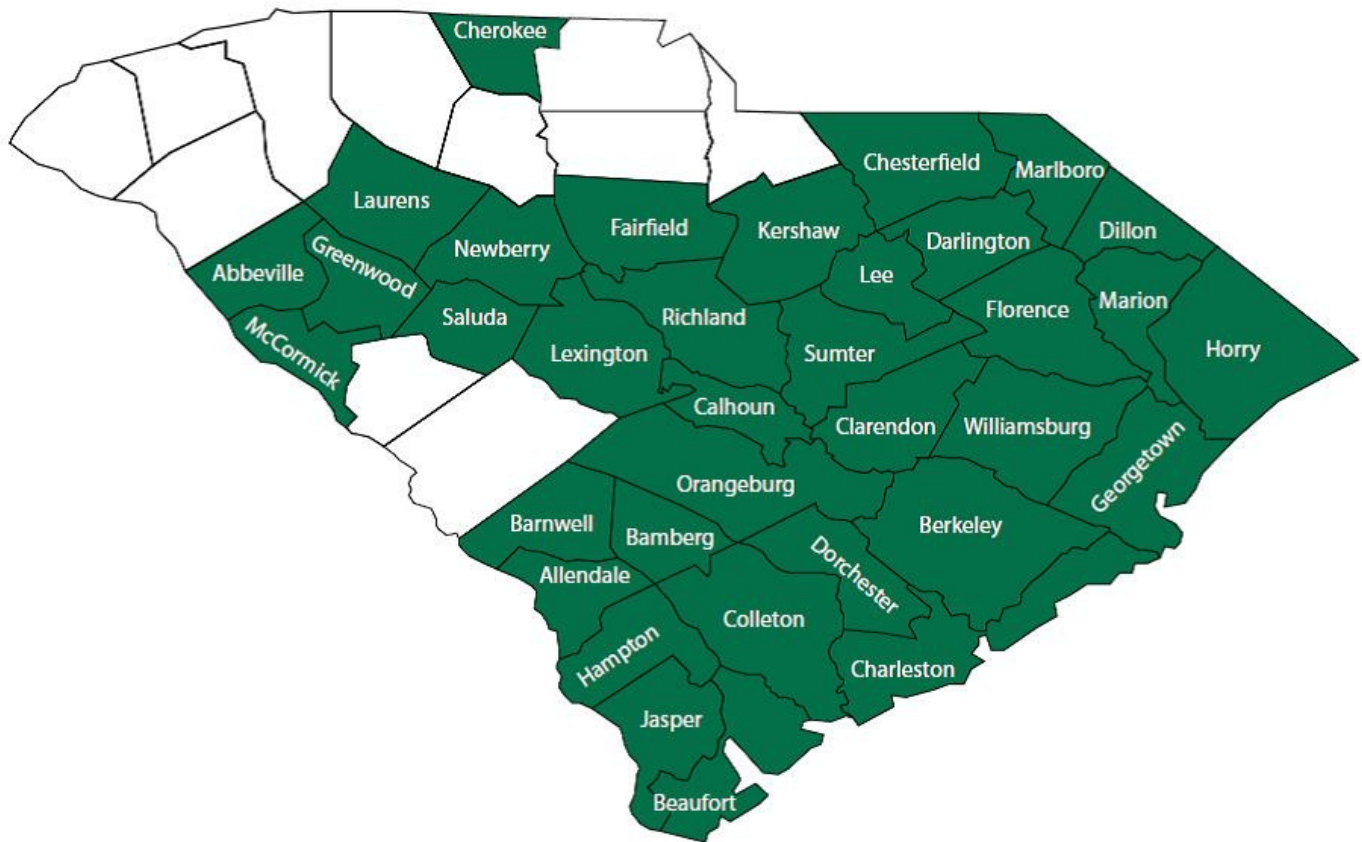
You and the teacher. Your program manager will share the teacher's contact information and you can then determine which dates and times are convenient for both parties.
